


4. Examiners' Reports

The Principal Examiners' reports (often referred to as 'Examiners' Reports') provide helpful observations and commentary on candidates' performance across the examined series.






5. Online Exam Review (Marked Exemplar)



If you are accessing the OER document in a web browser and are only able to see a single page, please download the document and re-open it in Adobe Reader in order to fully access the exemplar material.




Grade boundaries are the minimum number of marks needed to achieve each grade.

Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.


