


1. Key Documents

The documents are arranged in categories, and the documents in each category can be viewed by clicking the downward arrow alongside the category name.







2. Past Papers



Question papers from past examination series are available for:

Component 1 – Shakespeare and Poetry

Component 2 – Post-1914 Prose/Drama, 19th Century Prose and Unseen Poetry

Past papers on secure website (shortly after end of exam series)

Past papers are published initially on the <u>secure website</u> shortly after the end of the examination series.

Then use the dropdown menus to choose the papers that you are looking for:





3. Marking Schemes



They are published on Results day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Resources > Key Documents</u>.





5. Online Exam Review (Marked Exemplar)

<u>Exam Review</u> website and are made available shortly after results are issued for each series.










7. CPD Materials

This <u>series of resources</u>, using Macbeth as a starting point, exemplifies techniques teachers may use to help students develop the essay writing skills assessed in the Shakespeare section in Component 1.

Using contexts effectively in response to poetry



A <u>set of resources</u> to support the teaching of AO3 (context) in the poetry anthology. The resources look at the sort of relevant contextual details that are required through a series of interactive exercises and longer writing tasks.

Approaches to 19th Century texts in GCSE Literature and GCSE Language



These resources are designed to provide GCSE literature students with a greater understanding of the social, cultural, literary and historical context of the 19th century, while simultaneously challenging them to practise skills required for GCSE English Language.

Approaches to unseen poetry



<u>These resources</u> look at how to approach the unseen poetry section in the exam. It allows candidates to study the question stems and access past poems that have been used on the examination.

Knowledge organisers



A bank of <u>sample knowledge organisers</u> to support the learning of GCSE English Literature. These could be used for revision or as a starting point for creating your own knowledge organisers.



Exam Results Analysis




Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate/cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on the <u>secure website</u> and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.
