Learners entered for this qualification must sit both components at either foundation or higher tier in the same examination series.

Both Component 1 and Component 2 assessments comprise a number of short and longer, both structured and unstructured questions which may be set on any part of the subject content of the specification.

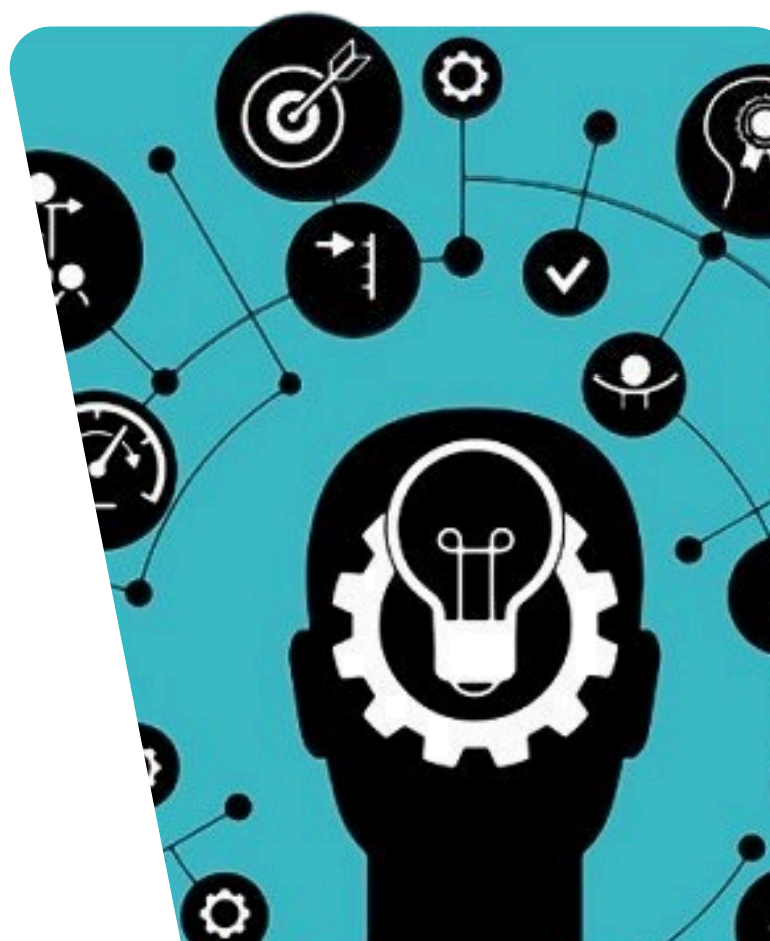

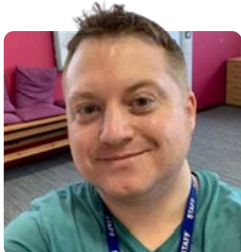
