#### 2022 results

#### Exam Results Analysis (Item-level data)

Found on the <u>secure website</u>, this allows you to compare your candidates' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall. It enables you to work out where they have done well and where future cohorts may be able to improve their attainment.

## **Examiner Reports**

Principal Examiner reports have been written for every component and paper type of the GCSE course. These are now available on the Eduqas <u>subject page</u>. We highly recommend that you review these reports in depth as they highlight the findings of the examining teams for the summer 2022 examination series.
