

Eduqas GCE French Resources Guide

This booklet provides an overview of the support, guidance, and resources available to those teaching the Eduqas GCE French specification across our suite of websites.

Subject webpage

The Eduqas GCE French <u>subject</u> <u>webpage</u> on the Eduqas website is the starting place for anyone teaching the specification. It contains a range of official documentation relating to the qualification, including the specification, sample assessment materials and past papers.

Portal

The <u>Eduqas Portal</u> is a secure area for centres to access resources. These include past papers and marking schemes (ahead of their publication on the public website), as well as access to CPD materials.

For teachers to access Portal, they will need a username and password. This will be set up by their Examinations Officer.

The Educational Resources website hosts free digital resources created by our dedicated team of subject experts and web developers to support the teaching and learning of Eduqas qualifications.

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


1. Key Documents


The documents are arranged in categories, and the documents in each category can be viewed by clicking the arrow alongside the category name.



















2. Past Papers



3. Marking Schemes



Marking schemes are available to accompany question papers from past examination series, providing instructions on how to apply the marking criteria, examples of indicative content, and assessment grids articulating the banded descriptors for different levels of responses.

Marking schemes on Portal (from Results Day)

Marking schemes are published initially on Portal on Results Day for the examination series.

Use the dropdown menus to choose the marking schemes that you are looking for:



They are published on Results Day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Key Documents</u>.




5. Exemplar Materials

Until Summer 2022, a set of Online Exam Review material for each exam component was published. These materials, which are still available online, include both clean and marked exemplars of candidate responses to key questions from previous examinations.

The OER materials can be used with students, to encourage them to review others' responses and discuss ways in which they may be improved, thus developing their own skills.

If you are accessing the OER document in a web browser and are only able to see a single page, please download the document and re-open it in Adobe Reader to fully access the material.

Clean copies of candidate responses and marked versions are also available to download from our <u>subject page</u> as a single pdf document, together with instructions for printing with or without Principal Examiner comments.





Autumn 2022	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2022 assessment series. Includes the Principal Examiner's observations about Components 1, 2 and 3, with examples of candidate responses. For each Component, practical advice is given for teachers to use in the classroom.	
Autumn 2019	Assessment > classroom practice – Approaches to teaching film and literature in MFL at GCE level.	
Autumn 2018	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2018 summer assessment series, exploration of examples of marked candidate responses and consideration of how feedback on assessments can inform teaching and learning.

Exam Walk Through – AS/A-Level French





Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on <u>Portal</u>, and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.
