Subject webpage

The Eduqas GCE English Language and Literature <u>subject webpage</u> on the Eduqas website is the starting place for anyone teaching the specification. It contains a range of official documentation relating to the qualification including the specification, sample assessment materials and past papers.

Online Exam Review

The Online Exam Review website hosts marked examination exemplar in an interactive digital format.

Portal

Portal is a secure area for centres to access resources. These include past papers and marking schemes (ahead of their publication on the public website), as well as access to CPD materials.

For teachers to access Portal, they will need a username and password. This will be set up by their Examinations Officer.

The Educational Resources website hosts free digital resources created by our dedicated team of subject experts and web developers to support the teaching and learning of Eduqas qualifications.

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


1. Key Documents



Past papers on Portal (shortly after end of exam series)

Past papers are published initially on Portal shortly after the end of the examination series.



3. Marking Schemes



Then use the dropdown menus to choose the marking schemes that you are looking for:





They are published on Results day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Key Documents ></u> <u>Examiners' Reports</u>






5. Exemplar Materials

Online Exam Review (OER)




Until Summer 2022, a set of Online Exam Review material for each exam component was published. These materials, which are still available online, include both clean and marked exemplars of candidate responses to key questions from previous examinations.

The OER materials can be used with students, to encourage them to review others' responses and discuss ways in which they may be improved, thus developing their own skills.



Grade boundaries are the minimum number of marks needed to achieve each grade.


If you click on 'Grade Boundaries' this will take you to <u>administration > Results, Grade</u> Boundaries and PRS..







Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on Portal, and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.
