Subject webpage

The Eduqas GCSE German <u>subject</u> <u>webpage</u> on the Eduqas website is the starting place for anyone teaching the specification and contains a range of official documentation relating to the qualification including the specification, sample assessment materials and past papers.

Portal

The <u>Eduqas Portal</u> is a secure area for centres to access resources. These include past papers and marking schemes (ahead of their publication on the public website), as well as access to CPD materials.

For teachers to access Portal, they will need a username and password. This will be set up by their Examinations Officer.


The documents are arranged in categories, and the documents in each category can be viewed by clicking the downward arrow alongside the category name.

Past papers on Portal (shortly after end of exam series)

Past papers are published initially on Portal shortly after the end of the examination series.

Past papers are published on the public website approximately twelve months after results for a series have been issued:



3. Marking Schemes



Marking schemes are available to accompany question papers from past examination series, providing instructions on how to apply the marking criteria, examples of indicative content, and assessment grids articulating the banded descriptors for different levels of responses.


Marking schemes on Portal (from Results Day)

Marking schemes are published on the public website approximately twelve months after results for a series have been issued:




4. Examiners' Reports






Materials from past CPD events

Autumn 2023	Assessment > classroom practice - review of the 2023 summer assessment series. Includes overviews of Component 1 (speaking) and Component 4 (writing), with the Principal Examiner's observations and examples of candidates' performance.
Autumn 2022	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2022 summer assessment series, exploration examples of marked candidate responses and consideration of how feedback on assessments can inform teaching and learning.
Autumn 2021	Assessment > classroom practice - Developing listening and reading resilience for GCSE MFL.
Autumn 2020	Assessment > classroom practice – Developing listening and reading resilience for GCSE MFL.
Autumn 2019	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2019 summer series; focusing on Unit 1 Speaking and Unit 4 Writing.
Autumn 2018	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2018 summer assessment series, exploration examples of marked candidate responses and consideration of how feedback on assessments can inform teaching and learning.

Language Tools




This is a bank of <u>tools</u> that allow teachers to use their own piece of text to generate a range of language-based activities.


Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on Portal, and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.


